Crandon Boulevard, which links all properties in the Village of Key Biscayne as well as Bill Baggs State Park, has long been one of the busiest roads in Miami-Dade County. In 2004, with input from hundreds of residents and business owners, as well as the village council, the firm developed the master plan to guide Crandon's improvement. The plan's objectives were to facilitate pedestrian and bicyclist safety; introduce lush tropical landscaping; effortlessly connect commercial, civic, and recreational areas; and present opportunities for public art, all while maintaining ease of auto travel.

The project has been developed in three phases, starting in 2005 and ending earlier in 2011. The result is a stunning and elegant yet laidback, "island-themed" boulevard, with eight small public plazas, made of terrazzo and tile by artists Jose Bedia and Sarah Morris, interwoven throughout. The team was even able to secure \$1,000,000 in county and state funding to allow the development of the streetscape project, which has impressed several hundred thousand residents and visitors since its inception half-a-decade ago.
